Trees and Shrubs

bareroot and container (when listed)

WHITE PINE

Pinus strobus

When planted in a row or grouping, this conifer species will grow quickly, form a privacy screen or windbreak and will do well in many soil types.

NORTHERN WHITE CEDAR

Thuja occidentalis

Can be trained to form a hedge or planted in a windbreak. This evergreen provides excellent cover for wildlife. Prefers sunny, well-drained sites.

CULTIVAR

Thuja occidentalis 'Emerald Green'

This cultivar is narrow, compact, conical, and dense. It holds a bright green color throughout the winter. Available as #3 container.

BLACK SPRUCE

Picea mariana

This "almost Ohio native" evergreen tree is more diminutive than its white spruce relative. Tolerant of wet and acidic soils.

CANAAN FIR

Abies balsamea var. phaneroipsus

Want to start your own Christmas tree grove? This rare-in-the-wild subspecies is native to isolated pockets in the mountains of WV and VA. This densely needled fir is great for windbreaks and privacy screening.

JACK PINE

Pinus banksiana

This "nearby native" pine can add some species diversity to your evergreen collection. Does best in well drained soils.

BLACK GUM

Nyssa sylvatica

Glossy, dark green leaves turn yellow, orange, brilliant red and purple. The bluish-black fruit is loved by many birds. Tolerates a wide range of soils and light conditions. Also available as #5 and #1 container.

SHINGLE OAK

Quercus imbricaria

The leaves of this species are not a typical "oak shape" instead they are a glossy green and are laurel-shaped. Mature height of 50-75 feet, tolerant of a wide variety of habitats. Also available as #1 container.



SHELLBARK HICKORY

Carya laciniosa

A relative of the familiar shagbark hickory, this species prefers moist bottom land soils. Nuts are edible.



AMERICAN SYCAMORE

Platanus occidentalis

The white bark of this tree species is a year-round indicator of the wettest landscape spots. This tree will grow quickly and can eventually reach 120'. Also available as #3 container.



PAWPAW

Asimina triloba

Known for its banana-like September fruits, large tropical-looking leaves and unique, rich red flowers, this tree provides 3 seasons of delight. Also available as #1 container.



PEACHLEAF WILLOW

Salix amygdaloides

Like many willows, this species can have one or many trunks. Perfect for planting in wetlands and soggy spots, along pond edges and streambanks.



REDBUD

Cercis canadensis

Most famous for its spring branches which are covered in pink-purple flowers. This well behaved shade-loving tree is a perfect landscape tree as it rarely grows larger than 20'. Also available as #1 container.



AMERICAN HAZELNUT

Corylus americana

This multi-stemmed shrub forms a rounded top. Half inch long edible nuts ripen in autumn. Prefers well-drained soils.



AMERICAN BLADDERNUT

Staphylea trifolia

This thicket forming shrub can grow to 10-15 feet, but it can be trained to a small tree or a hedge if desired. Likes moist, shady spots. Persistent seed pods provide winter interest.



BUTTONBUSH

Cephalanthus occidentalis

Great at controlling erosion on pond edges and streambanks, this shrub could grow in a bathtub. It has spherical white flowers and provides food and cover for wildlife. Also available as #3 container.



COMMON WITCHHAZEL

Hammamelis virginiana

A large shrub with intriguing crooked branches and zig-zagged twigs. It is prized for spidery yellow flowers that bloom in late fall. Does well in sun or shade. Also available as #10 container.



DWARF SERVICEBERRY

Amelanchier spicata

Also called thicket serviceberry, this small, native, deciduous shrub is found in disturbed sites, meadows, forest edges, and fields. Growing 3-5 feet tall and wide it can form dense thickets. It is drought tolerant once established. Grow this shrub in average somewhat dry well-drained soils, preferably acidic, with full sun to partial shade. Great as a hedge, or a border to naturalized areas, or native gardens. Tasty June berries are great for people and wildlife.



FRAGRANT SUMAC

Rhus aromatica

This compact dense rounded shrub has fragrant, butterfly and hummingbird attracting flowers. It likes well and excessively drained sites and once established is tolerant of drought. Great for Lake Erie shoreline stabilization.

CULTIVAR

Rhus aromatica 'Gro-Low' is available as #3 container.



MEADOWSWEET

Spiraea alba

This 2-4' tall, suckering shrub grows well in moist soil. It has white-colored spikes of flowers from mid-summer to early autumn. Good for ponds and low spots in the landscape. With watering it also makes a nice low hedge! Also available as #3 container.



NORTHERN BAYBERRY

Myrica pensylvanica

This tall dense-branching deciduous shrub has narrow, leathery, grayish-green leaves and waxy berries that are sure to attract birds. It is salt tolerant too! Also available as #3 container.



PRAIRIE WILLOW

Salix humilis

This 2-12 ft tall shrub often forms thickets. The stems are yellowish to brown. It has gray-green to blue-green foliage in the growing season. Unlike most willows, Prairie willow does well in both wet and dry soils in full sun. It is a great species for erosion control and shoreline buffers.



SPICEBUSH

Lindera benzoin

This understory shrub/small tree with lemon-scented foliage and red berries is great for attracting wildlife like swallowtail butterflies and songbirds.

ARROWWOOD VIBURNUM CULTIVARS

Viburnum dentatum

This is an upright, rounded, multi-stemmed, deciduous shrub typically matures to 6-10' tall with a similar spread. Non-fragrant white flowers appear in late spring. Flowers give way to blue-black, berry-like drupes which are quite attractive to birds and wildlife. Glossy dark green summer leaves fade to attractive shades of yellow, orange, and red. It is named arrowwood viburnum because Native Americans used the straight stems to make arrows. The arrowwood viburnum is one of the hardiest and easiest to grow of all viburnums for the garden.

BLUE MUFFIN® ARROWWOOD VIBURNUM

Viburnum dentatum 'Christom'

Compact variety that typically matures to 3-5' tall and as wide. Available as #5 container.

CHICAGO LUSTRE® ARROWWOOD VIBURNUM

Viburnum dentatum 'Synnestvedt'

Named for its bright, shiny green mature foliage. It can grow to a mature size of 12' x 10', blooms in late May-early June with white flower clusters and blue-black fruit in the fall. This cultivar is noted for producing fruit more abundantly than the species. Available as #5 container.



COMPACT INKBERRY

Ilex glabra 'Compacta'

Inkberry is a North American Eastern Coastal Plain species. 'Compacta' is a denser, shorter form of common inkberry, evergreen and suitable for most garden conditions. This fast-growing shrub will reach its full size in just a few years, and serves as an Eastern US Native alternative to boxwood hedges. This shrub does sucker, so cut new shoots early in the season if you wish to limit horizontal expansion. It is also fairly salt, wet site, deer, and rabbit tolerant. 'Compacta' is a female cultivar and will set small jet black fruit if a male shrub is nearby. Available as #5 container.

AMMON'S BLUE PASSIONFLOWER

Passiflora incarnata 'Ammon's Blue'

New Richmond, Ohio residents Dewey Hollister and his young daughter Ammon liked to eat passion fruit from the native vine in their yard. They would spit the many seeds out wherever they were. Some of these grew into plants and one was noticed to have larger parts and deeper blue flowers than the original native species. Hollister selected this one to reproduce and named it 'Ammon's Blue' after his daughter. Available as #3 container.

RAIN BARREL Start collecting rain this spring with a 55-gallon barrel and DIY diverter kit. Individual barrels, diverter kits, and linking kits are also available.

TREE TUBE SHELTERS 2' plastic tubes to protect your tree seedlings. Vented to allow for dormancy.

TREE FLAGS White flags on wire to help minimize mower casualties.

SOIL TEST KITS Soil test kits from Penn State, measure soil nutrients and organic matter.

NATIVE WILDFLOWER SEED These native wildflower and grass mixes from OPN Seed are great for bringing diversity and wildlife habitat to your property.

Order pickup will be in the **Natural Resources Building at the Lake County Fairgrounds, 1301 Mentor Ave., Painesville, Oh 44077**

Pick-up times are **Friday, April 25 from 9 AM to 6 PM** and **Saturday, April 26 from 9 AM to Noon.**

If you provide your email you will receive a pickup reminder.

Lake SWCD is not responsible for orders that are not picked up by noon Saturday. If you cannot pick up your trees, please make arrangements for someone else to pick them up.

Bare root orders will be distributed in woven sandbags, and should fit in most cars. Container trees and shrubs will fit in most vehicles laid upon their side. Larger orders of container trees may require a larger vehicle, such as a pickup truck.

There may be additional seedlings and conservation gifts for sale on pick-up day. Walk-ins are welcome (and encouraged!) but subject to availability.

We reserve the right to make substitutions if necessary. The plants are nursery inspected to be disease-free.

Lake SWCD cannot guarantee their survival after distribution. Planting instructions and species information will be provided when you pick up your trees.
